There is a need for coordinated efforts from all stakeholders including industry to tackle this menace, he said at the Anti-Smuggling Day launch event, organised by Ficci CASCADE (Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy).

The government has always been committed to combating the menace of smuggling and has institutionalised coordination between agencies, which has helped in generating volumes of information that are not only timely but also accurate leading to major seizures, he said.

Referring to a recent seizure, he said, DRI in Manipure effected a seizure of 12.5 kg of gold coming across from Myanmar and over 46 lakh sticks of cigarettes worth ₹9.5 crore in one single operation last week.

The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI), under the CBIC, is an intelligence and enforcement agency of Government of India on anti-smuggling matters.

Anti-Smuggling Day is launched with an objective of enhancing coordination and cooperation between law enforcement agencies, facilitating better exchange of information and experiences, and build-

"Despite smuggling being a global menace, due focus and thrust has not been given to this mounting threat which is not only damaging our exchequer and leading to job losses but is also impacting the safety and security worldwide. In this context, it is critical to emphasize and generate global awareness about the fact that the root cause of illicit trade lies in smuggling," said Ficci CASCADE chairman Anil Rajput.

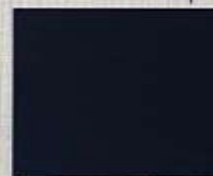

## FICCI CASCADE's Anti-Smuggling Day leads the battle against illicit trade

If you love shopping or like to frequent malls and markets, you couldn't have missed the sight of fancy watches, chocolates, cosmetics and even flavoured cigarettes being sold of brands that don't sound very Indian. In some places, these goods are concealed, while in other places they are passed on to buyers as 'imported' items. In reality, the majority of these goods are smuggled into the country and then distributed in different regions. This illicit trade is worth millions, if not more, and it goes on largely unchecked.

The menace of smuggling has spared no nation. With the advances in technology and transportation systems over the last few years, it has only expanded, compelling enforcement agencies to be constantly watchful. Surprisingly, the international community, while acting at the country level, does not have a lighthouse global initiative that is able to mobilise stakeholders to get rid of this menace. As a result, nations continue to suffer massive economic and job losses and people end up putting their lives at risk by consuming counterfeit and smuggled goods that only benefit syndicates and terror outfits.

To fill this void FICCI's Committee against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy (CASCADE), recently launched Anti-Smuggling Day. Starting in 2022, this day will be observed on February 11, and it will bring together key stakeholders, such as policymakers, international institutions, enforcement agencies, industry members, media and consumers who will be able to reinforce their commitment to act against this scourge.



Anti-Smuggling Day holds great significance because it is a first-of-its-kind initiative that is aimed at going beyond the rhetoric and encouraging all concerned parties, especially consumers, to translate good intentions into concrete action. FICCI CASCADE realises that consumers have the power to lead the battle against smuggling and so it will use this day as an opportunity to reach out and inspire them to uproot this menace, which is a grave threat to them and their country. Given the fact that smuggling is a concern the world over, this initiative has the potential to turn into a global movement led by consumers and supported by policymakers, enforcement agencies and others.

The rampant smuggling of gold, cigarettes, cosmetics, jewellery, readymade garments, alcohol, capital goods, consumer electronics and other goods are potentially disastrous for any economy. According to a 2019 study by FICCI CASCADE, large-scale smuggling in just five Indian industries — textiles, tobacco products, readymade

garments, capital goods and consumer durables — resulted in the loss of a whopping Rs

1,72,53 crore to the economy. It also led to 16.36 lakh jobs being lost. At the global level, a World Economic Forum estimate suggests that in 2020, \$2.2 trillion (approximately 3% of the world's GDP) was lost due to

illicit trade.

The affects of smuggling are not limited to the economy. Large-scale smuggling operations are often led by crime syndicates who use their illegally obtained wealth to support nefarious activities like terrorism and internal conflicts. Further, people run the risk of losing their lives by consuming substandard goods. "Illicit trade in smuggled goods is a global problem of enormous magnitude and nations are reeling under its devastating impact. Unfortunately, not enough awareness and thrust is being given to this growing threat, which is not only draining our economies and leading to job losses, but is also a huge risk to the security of nations

worldwide. If the spread of smuggling is not checked, the consequences will be disastrous for our future generations and hence we must take a holistic view to curb this evil," said Anil Rajput, Chairman, FICCI CASCADE.

While there are no dearth of policies and enforcement agencies in India to check this rampant crime, what's missing is the fine balance between three key levers — the right taxation, tight enforcement and consumer awareness — to take on smuggling. That's why FICCI CASCADE's Anti-Smuggling Day, is a forum for national and international officials to discuss ways to tackle this menace. To ensure the interest and involvement of the youth, the programme involves initiatives like the recently held national digital art/poster-making competition, the winners of which were felicitated during the event.

FICCI CASCADE's Anti-Smuggling Day is therefore, not just another event in an already busy annual calendar — it serves as a platform to bring about real change at the ground level.
